

Delve deep and explore Utsunomiya

With only an hour's journey from Tokyo, Utsunomiya is conveniently situated between Tokyo and Nikko. It's home to the Oya District and the Wakayama Bamboo Farm, which are both popular attractions. In Oya, you can take a 60 m descent into an underground stone mine, that was dug by hand! Feel the impressive scale of work that has been done to mine these igneous rocks only found in Oya.

Built into a cave, this one of a kind temple is home to Japan's oldest stone Buddha.

"Heiwa" means peace in Japanese. This 27 m statue was carved into the rock face over 6 years.

How to get there



About 30min from JR Utsunomiya Station. From West Exit go to Bus Stop No.8. From there take the [52] heading to Ishinada, San-nou Danchi or take the [56] heading to Nikko Toshogu, Imaichi Shako or take the [58] heading to Funau.

Get off at Osugiya Bus Stop and walk for 9 min. Bus

About 20min from Tobu Utsunomiya.

From Tobu Ekimae Bus Stop take the [52] heading to Ishinada, San-nou Danchi or take the [56] heading to Nikko Toshogu, Imaichi Shako or take the [58] to Funau. Get off at Osugiya Bus Stop and walk for 9 min.

TOP TIPS TO REMEMBER

1.OTOSHI - TABLE CHARGE

It is common in Japan to pay a sit down fee when in a bar. You will be compensated with a small snack which can range from a salad to a small dish of vegetables or meat. It is uncommon to refuse this.

2.TIPPING

This is not customary in Japanese culture and although you may feel you want to tip for good service, it can come across as rude or insulting. Tipping is also unnecessary in other situations such as taxis or hotels.


3.PAYING THE BILL

After ordering a meal the staff will usually leave your bill on the table ready for you to take it to the cashier at the end of your meal. In a bar you may have to ask for the bill which in Japanese is," Okaikei wo onegai shimasu".

4.MUSIC CHARGE

Some bars that offer live music may charge an entrance fee when they are performing live music.
